- · 2022: Playing with La Indiana, Aguerre had an average of 1.3 goals per game with.

Aguerre has played in a myriad of tournaments over the years. To honor his dedication to the sport of polo and his success, Aguerre was inducted into the Museum of Polo and Hall of Fame in 2017. Throughout his career, he experienced great triumphs, some of the most notable being his wins at both the US and Argentine Triple Crowns. He also was named the best mounted player three times at the Argentine Open and won the Argentine Open with different teams across different generations.

Aguerre moved to the US when he was 16 to play for White Birch where he would go on to play for 20 years. He has won the C.V. Whitney Cup 6 times, USPA Gold Cup 8 times and the U.S. Open Polo Championship twice. In 2006, Aguerre was named best mounted player in Palm Beach.

- 2023 Highlights: In both the C.V. Whitney Cup and the USPA Gold Cup, Armstrong led Aspen in his field goal percentage with 100% made in both tournaments.
- 2022: In the 2022 Gauntlet of Polo, Armstrong played with La Indiana and helped secure the team's 2-1 record for both the Gold Cup and C.V. Whitney matches.
- 2021: Playing for Aspen/Dutta Corp again, Armstrong averaged 0.8 goals per game, 2.5 throw in wins, 0.5 assists per game, 1.9 steals per game, and 0.2 hooks per game.
- 2019: Armstrong played for Aspen and scored 4 goals in the USPA Gold Cup. He helped in producing goals throughout the tournament as well, allowing Aspen to average 9.8 goals per game. Aspen advanced to the USPA Gold Cup Finals, but fell short to Pilot.

Most recently, Armstrong played in the 2019 Gauntlet of Polo. In 2018, he was named MVP of the season at Aspen Valley Polo Club, where he plays during summers. At the peak of his career, Armstrong held a 7 goal handicap. Back in the 1980s, Armstrong competed in and won the C.V. Whitney Cup not once, but twice.

While he studied finance at the University of Texas in Austin, he would drive 80 miles on the weekends to play polo in San Antonio. In 2019, he received the Hugo Dalmar Trophy again for his sportmanship on and off the field, an award which he first received back in 1984. Stewart was also elected as the new USPA chairman in 2019.

In 2021, Bensadon won the Prince of Wales Trophy in the UK with Thai Polo. He also scored the most goals in the Open de France. Bensadon played for Chapaleufu in the Clasificacion Palermo as well.

- 2021: Bickford played again with his team La Indiana. He averaged 1.5 goals per game, 2.2 throw in wins, 0.2 assists, 1.2 steals, and 0.4 hooks.
- 2020: Improving significantly from 2019, Bickford's contributions to La Indiana more than doubled, with him scoring an average of 1.7 goals per game as opposed to the previous 0.8. Bickford and La Indiana were victorious in the C.V. Whitney Cup Final in 2020.
- 2019: In his first Gauntlet of Polo, Bickford played for La Indiana. On average, he scored 0.8 goals and won 1.8 throw-ins per game. He excelled at the #1 position and was very adept at receiving passes and moving the ball down the field.

Bickford has been playing competitively since 2014 when he competed in and won the Prince of Wales Trophy. Since then, he has won the Queens Cup and the Sotogrande Gold Cup Final many times. More recently, he also triumphed in the 2020 C.V. Whitney Cup Final and the 2020 Ylvisaker Cup Final.



- 2022: Andrey Borodin served as the patron on Park Place. They won the C.V. Whitney, made it to the USPA Gold Cup final, and made it to the U.S. Open semifinal.
- 2021: Borodin stuck with his team Park Place. He averaged 0.6 goals per game, 1.0 throw in wins, 0 assists, 1 steal, and 0.1 hooks. His team ended up winning the C.V. Whitney Cup.
- 2020: Scoring 5 times, Borodin averaged 38.5% of field goals attempted. He averaged 0.6 goals per game and won, on average, 1 throw-in per game.
- 2019: Borodin competed with Park Place and played the #1 position. He converted 2 of his 3 shot attempts and proved that he is a real threat in the red zone. Borodin was also very successful at receiving passes from his teammates.

In 2022, Borodin competed in UK season with Park Place; in the Queens Cup Final, the British Open Semifinal, and the Prince of Wales Trophy in 2020 and in 2019, he played in the British Open Semifinal and the Queens Cup Final. Borodin competed in the Royal Windsor Final in 2018 and the Challenge Cup, Royal Windsor, and the Duke of Sutherland Final in 2017.

- 2022: Juan Britos played with Park Place. Park place won the C.V. Whitney cup and was a finalist in the USPA Gold Cup and the U.S. Open. Juan Britos was runner-up with Park Place Vaara in the Queen's Cup. Juan also played with La Irenita in the Argentine Triple Crown
- 2021: Britos was a key contributor to Park Place's success. He averaged 2.6 goals per game, 4.2 throw in wins, 1.4 assists, 3.8 steals, and 2.4 hooks. In the final of the C.V. Whitney Cup (which Park Place won narrowly over Scone), Britos' horse "Mega Big Bay" was named 'BPP Argentine Breed'. The horse was loaned to Britos by Lerin Zubiaurre.
- 2020: Britos averaged 2.4 goals per game and 1 penatly goal per game. He also won 3.2 throw-ins per game, on average for Park Place.
- 2019: Britos, playing for Park Place, averaged 3.6 goals per game and won, on average, 4.3 throw-ins per game. He was a brilliant decision maker and was able to create ample scoring opportunities for his team through passing or running with the ball.

Britos competed in and won the 2020 British Open, the 2019 Coronation Cup, British Open and Queens Cup.

- 2023 Highlights: In the 2023 Gauntlet of Polo, Cambiaso played with Scone and made the most assists in the USPA Gold Cup with 3.2, which contributed to their overall victory in the tournament and secured his second Gold Cup title: his first major polo title without his father, Adolfo. Cambiaso also made the most hooks at 5.3 in the U.S. Open Polo Championship where Scone finished as a quarterfinalist.
- **2022:** Playing for team Scone, Poroto was a finalist in the C.V. Whitney Cup. He played alongside his father Adolfo Cambiaso.
- · Poroto served as a substitute in the Wellington Polo Tour. After the U.S. high goal season, he travelled with Scone to play in the UK high goal season. In december of 2022, Poroto won the 129th Hurlingham Open and the 129th Argentine Polo Open on team La Dolfina alongside his father Adolfo Cambiaso
- 2021: Joining the Gauntlet for the first time alongside his dad, Poroto's young age did not stop him from making waves. Averaging 3.1 goals per game, 3.5 throw in wins, 1.5 assists per game, 4.4 steals, and 1.3 hooks, Poroto dominated the field and made a name for Scone. He was awarded Most Valuable Player in the USPA Gold Cup. He also joined Nic Roldan as the youngest winner of the U.S. Open at only 15 years old.
- Despite his young age, Adolfo Jr. has already played in several high-goal tournaments. In 2020, he played in the Pilar Cup, Tortugas Open Final, the British Open, and the Founders Cup. In 2019, he played in the Abierto Argentino Juvenil Final and the San Jorge Open. In 2018, he played in the Royal Windsor. He was also named MVP of the 2017 PTF International Cup at just 11 years old.

Son of Adolfo Cambiaso, Adolfo Jr. has already reached a 5 goal handicap at the age of 15.




